Bill Laster and Angie Ransom were likewise honored with the Masters <u>Ultra Runner of the Year</u>. The awards are a result of the hard work that AURA Bob Marston does in keeping track of the ultra races that Arkansan's participate in throughout the year.

If you are thinking about buying that <u>someone special</u> something different for Christmas, I've got a tip for you. AURA's David Horton, one of the U.S's top Ultra Runners has written a book that covers his run of the Appalachian Trail in 1991 and the 1995 TransAmerican Foot Race. January 1st begins a series of winter time 50K fun runs and races. Two days after the January 1st Fat Ass 50K, we will tackle the Albert Pike Recreation Area and the Ouachtta Mountains with a first time fun run loop using the forest roads near Langley, Arkansas. The Big Loop will be 32 miles and will be dry; the Little Loop will be 24 miles and will have plenty of water crossings. I hope to have the next newsletter out before then with a map of these two.

ULTRA CORNER

Since our last talk we have had the opportunity of going to Memphis on November 7th for the SHELBY FARMS 50/50. This is a 50K/50 Mile trail run along the Wolfe River in

metro Memphis. It is hosted by members of the Memphis Chapter of the Hash House Harriers and turned out to be a very decent race. Shelby Farms is an urban city park(very,very big). Lou and I went over the night before to camp out at the start/ finish which was under the Wolfe River Bridge near I-240. This was the first year for the event and despite its low key approach attracted a good number of Arkansans. LRRC's Robert Orr was second male with 7:17, Jack Evans was 4th male in 7:46; Randy Davidson(9:06); and Van Davis(9:19). Lou Peyton finished the 50 miler in 10:54. In the 50K Roberta Orr was second female in 5:07; Ann Moore with a 7:22 and Bobbie Davidson finished her first ultra run in 8:43.

While we were in Memphis LRRC's Bob Marston was in Troy, Missouri running the QUIVERING QUAD. This a trail run covering 50K and 50 Miles. Bob ran 10:29 in the 50 Mile. Nick Williams and #1 son, Roger, ran the 50K in 6:42. Bob's wife RoseMary finished the 50K in 6:51.

It is hard to believe but in February we begin the 10th year of the AURA. As is our policy we begin our two month membership drive with the December issue. One of the reasons we do this is so that you can impress you friends and love ones with an new 1998 membership card in your Christmas stocking. ULTRA TRAIL SERIES

Please note that there are two hand to hand cross country up hill climbing opportunities on the way to the turnaround as well as a guaranteed river crossing times two. Also note that these two steep uphills must be slid down on the return.

The Whistlin' Dick(how it all began)

It seems I'm thinking more and more of my up bringing in Vicksburg, Mississippi these days. Growing up around the Civil War battle field like I did I was rather jaded to the stories of the War and what they did to us. Like I said I've been thinking...........Vicksburg is a city on a bluff. A hilly town. In fact growing up in Vicksburg you were automatically nicknamed a "Hill Billie." because only a billie goat could make it up and down those hills and ravines. My father's place of business was between the bluff and the Yazoo Canal. On top of the bluff was Washington Street and there was a Gas Station on Washington Street run by Paul Pride that overlooked the Yazoo Canal. My Father and many others bought gas from that station. Mr. Pride came from Arkansas to Vicksburg to play on our local Cotton States League baseball team called the Vicksburg Billies. The name of the Gas Station was the "Whistling Dick". Behind the station was a walkway to an overlook where rested a replica of the most famous canon of the Siege of Vicksburg, the Whistling Dick. Civil War history books and old newspaper clipping wrote of the exploits of this


