MESSAGE FROM THE BIGSHOT - Quachita Trail Revisited - I hadn't done anything on the Ouachita Trail for almost five years now. While running and crewing on the entire trail(239 miles) back in 1992, I developed a mild affection for this rocky path. But I hadn't missed it enough to go out and try anything on it until I got a couple of calls from Clint Cussik of the Saline County Striders late this fall asking the Pevton's to join them on the trail. Clint and Dale Burns(Malvern Runners) were semi-organizing run/walks on sections of the trail. Clint and Dale shuttle the runners out and let them run back to their cars and look after them at check points along the way. A section is usually in the 20/25 mile range. He called last week and said that they were doing the Flatside Pinnacle to Hwy 10 section. Of all the entire Ouachita Trail, the Hwy 10 section is my favorite. So on Jan 15th, we meet with Clint and the vans at Maumelle Picnic area on Hwy 10. My plan was for Lou to ride to Flatside Pinnacle in the van and start at 7:00 a.m. while I would drive to the Hwy 9 trailhead near William's Junction and start at 8:00 a.m. Lou would stop there and pick up our truck and drive back to Hwy 10. I was a little concerned about the logistics but as it turned out, it was a beautiful sunshiny day without hitches. My journey was 10.5 miles and was better than I remembered. The clear-cut sections near Hwy 9 are healing and the middle portions offer very scenic vistas of the Big Maumelle River. It took me 5 hours of steady pulling to make it through. Lou came in for the last two miles to check me out but I was right on schedule.

On February 26th AURA's Lloyd Moore will Direct the Year 2000 Lung Run Half Marathon here in down town Little Rock. Lou and I volunteered to man a water stop for the Half Marathon. I know that other AURA members are already heavy into helping Director Moore however if there is anyone wanting to assist us at the water-stop we want you there. Lou is trying to get up a weekly, leaderless run for Thursday Murray Park, 5:00 p.m. Distances will be about 4 miles. Meet at the Lock and Dam parking lot at the foot of Overlook Hill. One option is to run on the bike path to the I-430 bridge, do the River Mountain hill and return. Second option to run the UALR Xcountry course which is about a two mile grass loop.

Good news! I have been concerned about the status of the Strollin' Jim 40. But we finally made contact with a busy Gary Cantrell and is words were, "I hope we have enough Arkies for the Jim this year so we can have a decent Hog Calling. Race Up! May 6th.

ATHENS - BIGFORK TRAIL MARATHON

Arkansas' first and toughest marathon was held on January the 8th near the small community of Big Fork, Arkansas. It was the second year for this run and is the "brainchild" of AURA's David Samuel of Pearcy. Last year we were under Winter Storm Warnings from the weather service and as a result there were only a handful of runners. This year despite the threat of rain there were 20 runners in the Marathon and seven doing the shorter 17 mile fun run. David bills the race as the "toughest marathon" east of the Rockies and I believe he is correct. The lower Ouachita range is very impressive and the course goes over the 100 year old Athens to Big Fork mail route. It is mostly single track trail with seven or eight really nice mountain climbs. Hence the name-Athens-Big Fork Marathon. David was hoping for 40 or so runners this year; I predict that with good weather he will get it. The first runner for the marathon to finish(5:35:38) was an old name in local running circles-John Gaston. Back in the late 70's or early 80's, John won a lot of 5 and 10k races in central Arkansas. I remember him well as a younger man but did not recognize him until he had already left my aid station. When he was in the Little Rock area, he worked somewhere as a "chef" then went to medical school. He is now a physician living in Fort Polk, Louisiana, and is 43 years old! Did I hear someone say he was thinking about moving back to Arkansas.
