

THE LATEST FROM MEMPHIS (contributed by Mike Samuelson)

On Sunday January 15th, for the first time in too many years, an Ultra was conducted in the Memphis area. A group of Warthogs led by Leigh Tanner conducted the inaugural Friends of the Forest Swamp Stomper 50K/25K in Meeman Shelby Forest State Park in Millington, TN. This well organized but little advertised event was very successful in that \$500 was raised to support future trail maintenance of park trails. There was one AURA member, Kevin Dorsey, 2nd finisher in the 50K, and probably several future AURA members in the finish listings. Congratulations to well known Warthog Jon Hazen who completed the Swamp Stomper 50K - his first ultra finish. The 2007 Swamp Stomper is scheduled for Sunday, January 14th, 2007 – more info will be disseminated as determined.

There are advantages and disadvantages to living in the Memphis area. The big disadvantage is living 3-4 hours from most AURA runs. On the other hand, the Northern Alabama Huntsville/Birmingham area isn't much further from Memphis than Little Rock is. Just two years ago, there were three trail ultras in the Northern Alabama area, now there are six. Two years ago, Fleet Feet Huntsville commenced sponsoring of the Fleet Feet Grand Slam consisting of the Dizzy 50s (runners choose to run 50 miles, 40 miles, or 50K), Rocket City Marathon, Recover From the Holidays 50K, and the Mountain Mist 50K. Two AURA runners completed the 2005-2006 Grand Slam – Kevin Dorsey and Mike Samuelson. (see times in ULTRA CORNER)

The Rocky Raccoon 100

An Interview With AURA sister, Jenny Foster.

The Coach Doctor(CD) was pleased to learn that two AURA members traveled to Huntsville, Texas, for the 2006 Rocky Raccoon 100 Miler on February 4th. You might recall the Coach Doctor's Lament in the AUR April issue last year concerning the lack

of participation by Arkies at the Rocky Raccoon 100. This year Jenny Foster and Greg Eason finished in 23:50:38.

You were first female at the Gulpha Gorge Challenge, UTS # 5 this November, but have not done too many of the UTS runs. Can you share with us your background in running? I started running 7 years ago and at that point my aspirations were to run 6 miles. The first time I heard of a sport called ultra running, it planted a seed that I imagined would stay just that. It has taken a few years for it to develop to the point I was mentally ready to take the step and have the true desire. I ran my first 50 k (Sylamore 6:28:13) last spring and have been hooked on nothing but trail running since.

I'm sure you had a finish strategy working for you at the start. Were you able to stick with it and would you change anything if you were doing it all over?....I had a basic strategy of food and pace that I desired to keep. I had the greatest running partner(Greg) and coach the entire way that helped keep me focused on the task at hand...always focusing on the next aid station and nothing more. I hit a low point when it didn't seem possible that I would hit my 2 hours finishing window. However, there was never a point that I didn't think I would finish...even if it was the full 30 hours. There was defiantly the newbie learning curve – I would have carried caffeine pills(I have never fallen asleep during other 24-36 hours type events, why would I on this one) and nausea pills, and thought that I was xx miles from my support crew and thinking "that's not so far" I can always wait. 10 miles can be a long ways when you are falling asleep on your feet.

Sooo.......How did the race go?....MARVELOUS! It went so much better than I imagined it would and I'm glad Greg didn't get too bored with my pace. And, it looks like I'm only going to loose two toenails (those are some mean tree roots). For me it was an incredible journey for the mind and body (both incredibly fun and painful).

How are you feeling today? Ready to hit the trails, yet?....I feel great, other than a tendon in my ankle I would be hitting the trails now. As it stands, I'm out of commission for a couple of weeks. I'm getting a lot done around the house and I get to sleep in everyday! I can't wait to run another 100 miler!

Thank you Jenny for sharing your Rocky Raccoon 100 experience. For that you receive the first AURA Gold StarOh my!




Photo of Jenny Foster as she paces Greg Eason and Steve Kirk during their 2005 Ouachita Trail Crossing.

10 to 11 Miles of Mountains

7:00 a.m. start.

Description: Very mountainous National Forest roads including four miles of rough jeep roads. Course will be marked with flour. Water only at about midway. Crude maps will be provided.

Directions: West on Hwy 10 [35 miles] to Williams Junction Grocery Store. Turn left onto Hwy 9. Go about 6 miles on Hwy 9 to Lake Winona Road. Turn right and go three miles on Lake Winona Road. The first two miles will be blacktop; the third mile will be gravel. After three miles look for FSR 715 on the right. Follow FSR 715 for 1.8 miles to the intersection of FSR 715 and 179. Park.

Format: Bring a tube of frozen biscuits and a jar of old jelly or honey that you might have in your refrigerator. The BS will have his oversized Dutch oven by the campfire and we can all eat hot biscuits after the run.. No Points: No Times; No Questions Asked.

AURA HOT FLASH!

With Winter Storm Warning, Alerts and Advisories being posted on the Weather Channel, I was not concerned about how the new race directors of the Sylamore 50 Km would handle the developing situation as much as I was for our AURA brothers and sisters who had to make the decision about the travel. The only wrong answer was to take a chance. If you drove up on Friday and had gotten a room, you made a wise choice. There were a record number of entries and the race was closed a week early. When we arrived at Angler's Motel, the race head quarters, Friday afternoon, I was surprised at the number of runners checking in. At about 8:00 p.m. it started to rain which quickly gave way to snow. By the next morning there was perhaps 3 to 5 inches of powder on the ground. 208 runners showed up for packet pick-up; 188 runners started. Temperatures I have heard ranged from 18 to 21 degrees at 7:00 a.m. and got progressively colder throughout the day. 144 runners would finish. Being on Aid Station duty at Gunner Pool, Mile 10 and 20, I never heard anyone complain. Everyone seemed to take a certain amount of pride in overcoming adversity.

Congratulation to Race Director's Greg and Heather Eason for all the work that goes into making the Sylamore happen and for making the hard decisions look easy. My prediction is that as long as there is a Sylamore 50 Km, people who ran this one will be talking about the Sylamore of "ought six."

AURA brother, Tom Brennan, was first finisher with a time of 4:36:37 and Anna Assenmacher (out of state/I'll try to find where next month) was first female and 9th overall with a time of 5:13:42.
